

HPMVAC Update: Jan 27, 2022

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What's new

- For February, HPPH mass vaccination clinics will rotate through Huron-Perth while also maintaining some availability in Stratford and Goderich locations.
- At this time, all of HPPH community clinics are open for walk-ins; priority will continue to be given to booked appointments.
- Pediatric vaccine appointments, or walk-ins, are accepted at all HPPH clinics.

- Huron Perth Public Health is now using the Provincial Vaccine Booking System for COVID-19 vaccine appointments. Individuals are able to book their first, second, or booster doses of COVID-19 vaccine online at <https://covid-19.ontario.ca/book-vaccine/>.
- Appointments can be booked by calling the Provincial Vaccine Contact Centre at 1 833 943 3900 (open 7 days a week, 8 am- 8pm)

- Appointments can also be booked over the phone by calling the HPPH booking line 1-833-753-2098 (open 10:00 AM – 3:00 PM Monday-Friday).
- ONE CARE can provide free transportation to COVID-19 vaccination appointments across Huron & Perth counties for seniors and persons with a disability within the meaning of the Accessibility for Ontarians with Disabilities Act, 2005. Third doses

- The Omicron variant is the dominant variant in Ontario. Evidence suggests that a third dose or booster can further increase protection against severe illness and hospitalization. The increased transmissibility of the Omicron variant is putting additional strain on Ontario's hospital capacity, making it critical that all Ontarians receive their booster dose as soon as possible.
- All individuals aged 18 and over are able to receive a third dose, three months following their second dose.
 - Please note: Certain populations include individuals aged 16+ who are eligible for a third dose, including:
 - Healthcare workers (ages 16+). See the **full list** of healthcare workers eligible for third doses at www.hpph.ca/ThirdDose
 - First Nation, Inuit and Métis adults and their non-Indigenous household members (ages 16+)
- Before booking, we ask that everyone checks their eligibility & **ensures that enough time has passed since their last dose using our [third dose calculator](#)**. If anyone comes to a clinic before enough time has passed since their second dose, they will not be able to proceed with the appointment.

Proof of vaccination requirements

Provincial requirements

- The Ontario government continues to require people to be fully vaccinated and provide proof of their vaccination status to access certain businesses and settings. Information is available at <https://covid-19.ontario.ca/proof-covid-19-vaccination>.

- Effective January 4, 2022, the enhanced vaccine certificate with QR code is required, and the Verify Ontario app in settings where proof of vaccination is required. The QR code can be used digitally or by printing a paper copy. Individuals can download their enhanced certificate with QR code by visiting <https://covid-19.ontario.ca/book-vaccine/>.

How to get a provincial vaccination certificate

- All provincial vaccination certificates presented must include a QR code. The QR code can be used digitally or by printing a paper copy. If you previously printed a vaccination certificate and it didn't have a QR code, you will need to download your current version with the QR code.
- At any time you can download and print your vaccine certificate through the provincial portal at <https://covid19.ontariohealth.ca/> (please note there is **no** www in this web address)
- If you need help getting a copy of your receipt (online or a print copy) call the Provincial Vaccine Contact Centre at 1-833-943-3900.
- Public libraries across Huron Perth are also offering to help people print their vaccine receipt.

Current Vaccination progress

- As of Jan. 26, 2022, vaccination coverage in Huron-Perth **for ages 5 and over**, was as follows:
 - 84% of residents have at least one dose
 - 79.4% fully vaccinated (2 doses)
 - 48.6% 3rd Dose Coverage of those aged 18 years and over

Information for healthcare providers and pharmacists

- The province is recommending re-vaccination with a new COVID-19 vaccine primary series post-transplantation for individuals who receive hematopoietic stem cell transplants (HSCT), hematopoietic cell transplants (HCT) (autologous or allogeneic), and recipients of CAR-T-cell therapy, due to the loss of immunity following therapy or transplant.

Continue following Public Health Measures

- Regardless of vaccination status, everyone must continue to follow all public health measures as described in Reopening Ontario legislation because a significant number of our population must be fully vaccinated to provide enough protection. As long as COVID is still circulating in Ontario, it is important to continue public health measures, even if you are vaccinated.
