

What to do when you are being tested for COVID-19

Getting your test result

- You will be able to access your result through the online portal:
<https://covid19results.ehealthontario.ca:4443/agree>
- It could be 48 hours or longer before a result becomes available.
- If you do not have access to the portal or you do not have an OHIP (health) card, contact your testing location to receive your results.
- If your result is positive, you will be notified.

While waiting for your test result

If you have COVID-19 symptoms and/or you have been advised to be tested by a healthcare provider, the Ministry of Health screening tool, or public health		
Awaiting results: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Self-isolate (do not go to school or work) until you receive your results, even if you are fully vaccinated. Your unvaccinated household members must also self-isolate while you are waiting for results. Fully vaccinated household members do not have to self-isolate. 	If your result is positive: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Self-isolate Tell your close contacts to isolate 	If your result is negative: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> You need to self-isolate until symptoms are improving for at least 24 hours. If your household contacts were self-isolating, they can now stop isolating.

If you are a High Risk Contact of a positive case of COVID-19
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> You must self-isolate for 10 days from the date of exposure regardless of your vaccination status. Continue to self-isolate even if your test result is negative.

If you are being tested because you may have been exposed to a case, but you have not been identified as a High Risk Contact:
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> You do not need to self-isolate while you wait for your test results Your household members do not need to self-isolate while you wait for your results

Please note:

- Fully vaccinated means it has been at least 14 days since your second dose of COVID-19 vaccine.
- Remember that the COVID-19 test is a snapshot in time, meaning the results are valid on the date that the test was taken. A negative test result today does not rule out the possibility of a positive test result if tested again in the future.
