Childcare Setting Cleaning and Disinfecting Schedule

Cleaning and disinfecting are important to infection prevention and control in a child care setting. Some pathogens can live for hours, days or even weeks on toys, equipment and other surfaces. To reduce the spread of pathogens in your child care centre, the following table provides you with a cleaning and disinfecting schedule for different areas and items in your setting.

NOTE: Cleaning and disinfecting to occur more often if contamination has occurred (e.g. increased illness in the classroom, child vomits on item, etc.).

Toy Cleaning and Disinfecting Procedure

Step 1	Inspect Inspect to ensure there are no loose parts of broken/jagged edges that could pose a safety hazard. Ensure toys can withstand cleaning and disinfection.
Step 2	Clean = Wash + Rinse + Dry Wash: Soap and water using a scrubbing action Rinse: Potable water Dry: Air dry or with disposable towels
Step 3	 Disinfect Apply a disinfectant in one of the following ways: Fully immerse toys in the disinfectant for the required contact time. For large toys squirt/stream flow disinfectant or apply a saturated cloth with disinfectant directly to the surface of the toy for the required contact time.
Step 4	Rinse Toys must be rinsed thoroughly with clean potable water following disinfectant.
